PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

The Women's Shelter and Support Center empowers survivors on their journey of healing. Our emergency shelter in Rochester serves the 10-county region of SE Minnesota. Additionally, we have community advocacy programs in Dodge, Fillmore, and Olmsted Counties, along with transitional and permanent housing units located in Rochester.

Crisis Intervention & Advocacy

WSSC's emergency and ongoing advocacy services address immediate safety concerns and assist in the recovery from physical and emotional trauma, serving as a vital lifeline for individuals navigating through the aftermath of abuse.

- **1,811** Individuals received immediate and ongoing **advocacy services** for safety planning, civil/criminal court, restraining orders, and help with **emergency needs** (food, clothing, and personal items), housing, childcare, transportation, and other needs.
- **1,084** Individuals received **community referrals** for childcare assistance, legal services, housing assistance, financial resources, and other crucial supportive resources.
- 2,200 Callers to our 24-hour crisis line received information, assistance, and support for themselves or others.

"The abuse was so bad, I had to leave! If you [VVSSC] weren't here, I would be living in my car with my pets." - Client WSSC recognizes that pets are often abused or killed if left behind, therefore pets can accompany survivors staying at the shelter.

Shelter & Housing

The WSSC emergency shelter offers safety, while our transitional housing program provides extended support, helping survivors overcome barriers to stability.

- 208 (134 adults and 74 children) stayed at the emergency shelter and received advocacy.
- **7,155 Shelter nights** were provided, offering individuals affected by domestic violence a safe haven, free from harm or intimidation.
- <u>34</u> Days is the **average length of stay** per resident in our shelter.
- **9** Permanent **housing units** for WSSC were maintained.
- <u>22</u> Households (<u>28</u> adults and <u>43</u> children) utilized our **long-term supportive housing** programs from which <u>8</u> households moved on to **self-identified safe housing**.
- **29** Households were **assisted financiall**y to obtain or maintain their own stable housing.
- **108** individuals received additional **relocation assistance** from our agency.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Children and Youth

WSSC's children and youth programs promote resilience in young survivors, offering a safe space for children to express their feelings, process trauma, and learn healthy coping mechanisms.

<u>331</u> Children participated in <u>122</u> **interactive activities** throughout the year, such as field trips, holiday parties, and on-site activities (i.e. craft projects, story time, music, etc.).

259 Youth received **educational and supportive programming** through support groups, learning about topics such as self-esteem, anger, and communication skills.

Community Outreach & Volunteering

Our Community Outreach program raises awareness and increases understanding of the complexities of domestic violence and promotes early intervention and prevention. WSSC's Volunteer Program helps fulfill the diverse needs of the organization, providing valuable services in a variety of roles.

<u>1,588</u> Individuals attended <u>54</u> educational sessions, including the interactive "Why they Stay" presentations. Attendees included system professionals, college and high school students, community groups, organization teams, and other interested community members. WSSC also hosted **information booths** at numerous community health fairs and events.


<u>414</u> adults received support and education at <u>65</u> virtual and in-person **support group**s, learning about self-esteem, power and control, anger management, healthy relationships and related topics. Additionally, <u>259</u> children took part in complementary **support activities** alongside the adult sessions.

- **1,560** Individuals watched WSSC's **awareness videos** learning about domestic violence topics and services available.
- **<u>25</u> Volunteers** provided **<u>1,648</u>** hours of service, helping with support groups, data entry, graphic design, presentations, community booths, foster grandparent program, childcare, organizing material donations, maintenance, gardening, and other needs.
- 2,220 People follow WSSC's Facebook page with a reach of 3,700.
- **198** people attended the annual **Transforming Lives** fundraising luncheon to support and empower survivors on their path to safety.


